Key Developments

Digital Art Workshops

The Visual Arts Panel has been collaborating with the Computer Science and Design & Technology Panel to launch the Digital Painting Workshop, discovering that students' interest in multimedia creation exceeded expectations.

LYC Online Gallery

To boost LYC students' confidence and interest, the school established an online virtual exhibition platform in the 2022-23 academic year, allowing students more opportunities to showcase their creations while enhancing community awareness of the school's art education.



Curriculum and Facility Optimization

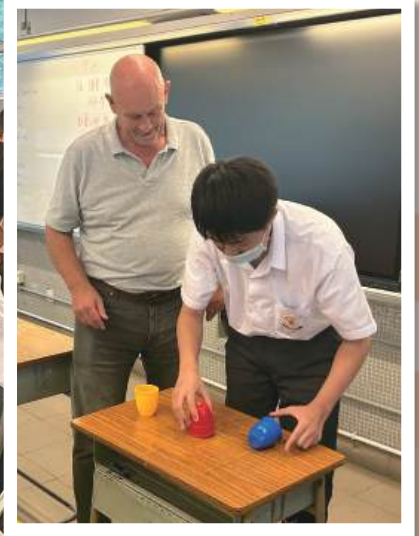
